This little novella moved me so much, by the time I was finished, tears were streaming down my face. It was incredibly and deeply moving and poignant. There is also a wonderful spiritual lesson here. This book will impact you. With her signature grace and heartwarming style, Joanne has crafted yet another unforgettable story: this time it may not end the way you expect. Going in, I knew how things might play out, so I was prepared to cry. Little did I know how joyful the end of the book would leave me.
