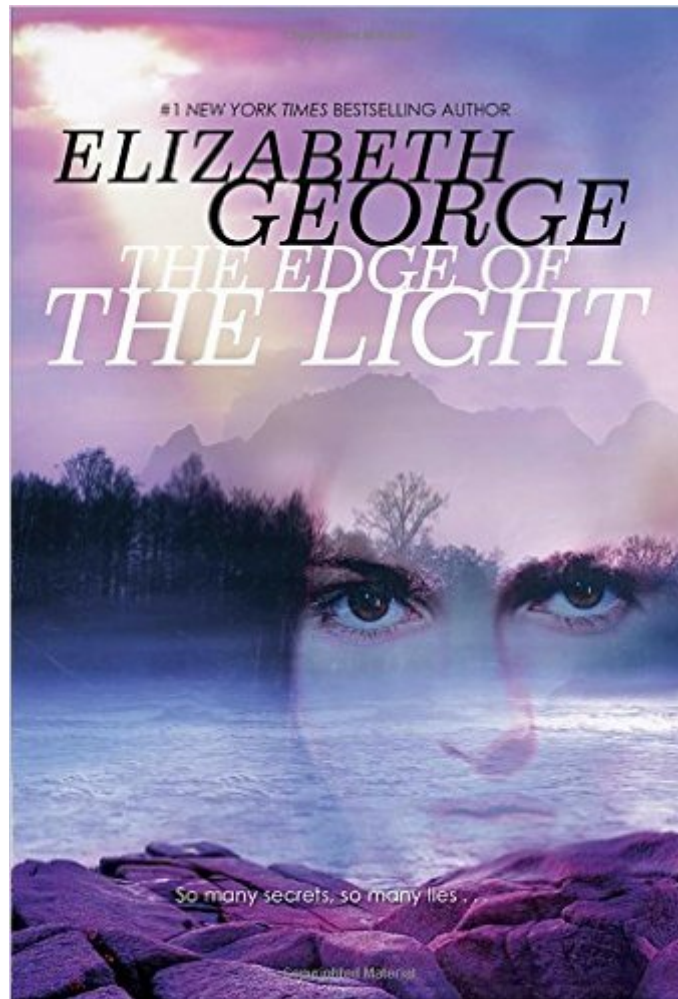

As a fan of Ms. George's Lynley books, I got the first book in this series for my (then-teenaged) niece, read it myself and ended up enjoying the others as well. I was stunned to realize that this supposed "final" book left major plot lines unresolved, but have been unable to discover any

resource that promises another installment. The book itself is well-written and interesting; no one builds tension like EG. But I feel ill-used by the bait and switch and am still looking for closure.

This didn't rate a five because Hannah/Becca still doesn't know what happened to her mother. I also found the resolution for Prynne and Seth to be pie in the sky. If this is the last book in this series it leaves me wanting more.

I have loved this series and the book itself is great....BUT how can this possibly be the conclusion to this series when there are still so many unanswered questions. I feel like there should have been a more completed end to Beccas story. Other story lines were left without a ending. I feel very confused and let down if in fact this was the final book, having said all that, I still loved the book series.
